| 4. Consider Trust Options |
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| [] Testamentary trust (for minor children or blended families) |
| [] Spousal trust (to protect current partner while ensuring children inherit later) |
| [] Review any existing trusts and update as needed |
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| 5. Review Joint Assets and Beneficiary Designations |
| [] Ensure joint property ownership aligns with your wishes |
| [] Update RRSPs, TFSAs, and life insurance beneficiaries |
| [] Avoid conflicting instructions between your Will and registered assets |
| 6. Plan for Incapacity |
| [] Create an enduring power of attorney |
| [] Draft a representation agreement |
| [] Ensure your spouse or children have the authority to act on your behalf |
| 7. Communicate with Your Family |
| [] Explain your intentions to reduce future conflict |
| [] Share where your Will and documents are stored |
| [] Keep peace by being open now, not later |
| 8. Review Regularly |
| [] Update your Will and documents after: |
| - A marriage or divorce |
| - A new child or grandchild |
| - A move or major asset purchase |
| - Any significant life change |
